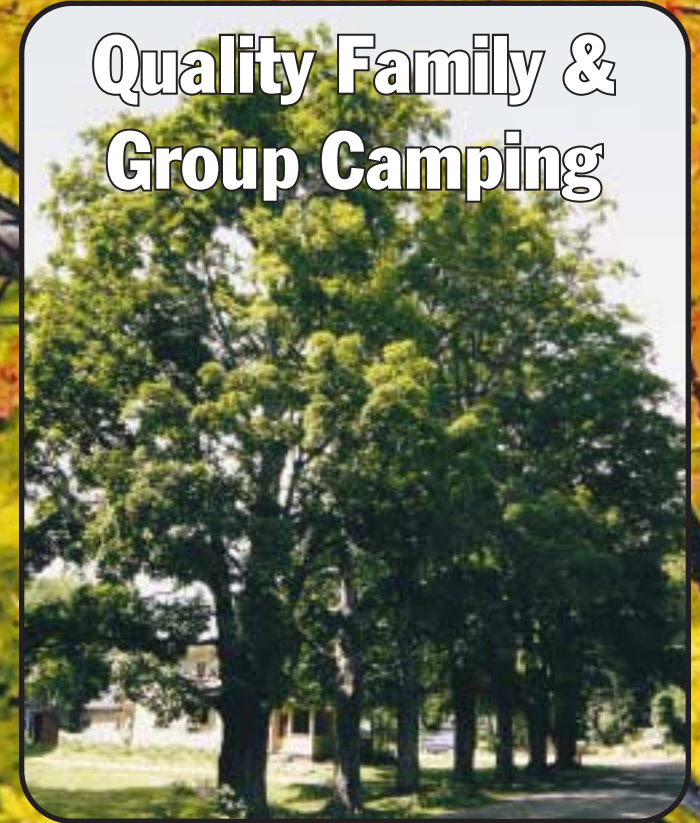

From Peterborough
Take Rt. 202 East, 9 miles. Take a left on Rt. 137 South, Longview Rd. is 3 miles on the right.
